07/12/2022 142.00 MOTION TO SEAL DOCUMENT

The foregoing, having been heard by the Court, is hereby:

ORDER: GRANTED

Pursuant to Section 11-20A of the Connecticut Practice Book, the court finds that:

(1) The document contains records statutorily protected under Connecticut Statute section 46b-124(b) ;
and

(2) The privacy interests in the information in the document overrides the public's interest in viewing the material.

Therefore, it is ordered that:

(1) the document or its attached exhibits or both containing records statutorily protected under Connecticut Statute section 46b-124(b) is or are sealed; and that

(2) Assistant Attorney General Belforti shall submit a redacted copy of the document within 10 days of this order.

(3) Assistant Attorney General Belforti shall send an unredacted copy to all counsel of record. Attorneys Williams and Mayo Goodrich must maintain the documents as confidential and not further disclose or disseminate. They may share the unredacted documents with their clients. However, their clients may not further disseminate and must maintain the records as confidential. Attorneys Williams and Mayo Goodrich must advise their clients of this court order and that the failure to abide by this order could subject the party or counsel to a contempt finding.

(4) At the conclusion of this case, all unredacted copies of said documents must be returned to Attorney Hardy-Massaró's counsel and/or other Attorneys Williams and Mayo Goodrich and their clients must file a statement under oath that said documents were shredded and destroyed.

The original documents containing the personal identifying information will be retained as a sealed document in the court file, unless the court orders otherwise.
